## Purpose/Background

The Division supports middle levels education and believes it to be a developmentally appropriate response to the unique characteristics and needs of learners ten to fifteen years of age. The middle years are a critical time in the intellectual, physical, social and emotional development of these students. The Division supports the establishment and on-going development of Division strategies and programs that respond to and meet the needs of middle level learners.

## **Procedures**

- 1. Schools are learning communities staffed with knowledgeable and skillful individuals who are adept in meeting the needs of early adolescents.
- Teams of school personnel form professional learning communities that facilitate interaction, interdisciplinary organization, the integration of curriculum and the establishment of high expectations for all.
- 3. Supportive systems exist that provide for student advocacy and foster the development of resiliency.
- 4. Middle level educators employ in all curricular areas a variety of developmentally appropriate instructional strategies and learning opportunities that are supported by current research and practice.
- 5. Middle level educators use a wide variety of developmentally appropriate assessment and evaluation practices to promote student learning.
- 6. Developmentally appropriate exploratory opportunities, consistent with the Program of Studies, are offered to all students.
- 7. Consistent with the goals of middle levels education, practices such as flexible scheduling, communities of learners, and student participation are evident throughout the development of procedures, programs and structures.
