- Must be enrolled in a recognized post-secondary program in Alberta or elsewhere in Canada (excluding applicants applying for Referral Program Support)
- Must work with an RLI Student Advisor to determine the level of support from Métis Students Services (if applicable) and commit to a Student Action Plan

 Must sign a disclosure citing all sources of funding that the student is receiving or applying to receive including any financial support from another Métis National Council member, the Manitoba Métis Federation, or Alberta Métis Settlements
